- May cover these types of expenses:
 - In-vitro fertilization process
 - Genetic testing
 - Fertility treatments
 - Adoption costs

ABOUT HEBREW FREE LOAN:

Interest-free loans are available to Michigan residents who are Jewish, who can demonstrate an ability to repay, and who have access to co-signers.

A person who is interested in a loan for themselves or a loved one calls Hebrew Free Loan at 248.723.8184, or logs on to www.hfldetroit.org to start the process. A loan application and financial questionnaire are completed before the loan request is reviewed by two selected members from the Hebrew Free Loan Board of Directors during an interview. Each potential borrower's information is treated with the utmost respect and confidentiality.

Hebrew Free Loan works in close partnership with other Jewish community agencies, and often refers potential borrowers to local resources that can be helpful for their individual needs.
